Highlights

● PATIENT CARE

Over the course of 2024, Regional Hospital of Scranton played a vital role helping people get well and live healthier at more than 349,000 patient encounters across its hospitals and Commonwealth Health Physician Network clinics and other sites of care.

● UNCOMPENSATED CARE

We provided more than \$28 million in charity and uncompensated care for the community's most vulnerable and have resources to help them secure medications and medical support devices.

● QUALITY EMERGENCY CARE

Our emergency department delivered medically necessary, life-saving care at more than 31,000 visits in 2024, regardless of the individual's ability to pay.

● ADDRESSING SOCIAL DETERMINANTS OF HEALTH

Through financial donations and acts of service, we support the local charitable and community organizations, including Northeast Regional Cancer Institute, The American Heart Association and The United Way, and our second annual Jars of Love drive collected more than 1200 jars of peanut and other nut butters for Weinberg Northeast Regional Food Bank and Bread Basket of NEPA.

● GROWING FUTURE PROVIDERS

Our hospitals support the education and development of future healthcare professionals through participation with organizations such as the Northeast Pennsylvania Clinical Education Consortium, led by Lackawanna College. This collaborative partnership brings together local colleges, healthcare professionals, and community partners to provide osteopathic medical students with meaningful clinical training experiences within our region. By supporting hands-on medical education, we are helping prepare the next generation of healthcare providers while strengthening the future of high-quality care in the communities we serve.

● ADVANCING SURGICAL CARE

Our hospitals and clinics have recruited surgeons and invested in minimally invasive techniques like robotic-assisted surgery. These options help patients with quicker recovery times and shorter lengths of stay. More than 9,000 surgeries were performed last year by the general, urologic, gynecological, gastrointestinal, colorectal, vascular and orthopedic surgeons on our medical staff.

● SPECIALIZED CARE AT MOSES TAYLOR HOSPITAL

For 25 years, we have delivered safe, compassionate maternity care to families across area, welcoming more than 50,000 babies since 2000. Our Level III Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU), the only one in the county, provides advanced, lifesaving care for our most vulnerable newborns. That same commitment to specialized, patient-centered care extends across the lifespan. Moses Taylor Hospital also offers short-term inpatient psychiatric services for adults age 55 and older through our Senior Behavioral Health Unit, providing individualized treatment focused on cognitive health, physical well-being, and overall quality of life.
